Leo was first appointed as an Assistant Veterinarian at the Department of Farm Animal Health and the Ambulatory Clinic in 1977. In 1982, he moved to the Central Veterinary Institute in Lelystad before returning to the Department of Farm Animal Health in 1987 with a part-time position until 1996, when he adopted a full time schedule. Leo's ability to apply his extensive knowledge of pathophysiology to real-life situations is still unparalleled to this day. We are so fortunate to have had him amongst us during all his years of service. Many students, employees and veterinarians will long remember his curious and critical drive.

For the past few years, Leo has been very dynamic in training and supervising junior lecturers at the Department of Farm Animal Health. He has shown great enthusiasm and passion in transmitting his expertise and knowledge, not only to his junior lecturers, but to students and fellow colleagues alike. In 2012, he was appointed as Professor of Porcine Health at the University of Pretoria, South Africa. He will continue to perform his duties there after his retirement.
